1. Sabbatical roles and responsibilities

PRES introduced the discussion, citing that this was a continuation from the previous meeting on the 3rd November.

PRES invited CEO to speak

CEO presented ideas to the group as how to potentially work through the task, suggesting that the methodology be worked from the following:

- What is the sabbatical's purpose?
- What are the elements within the roles?

Following this the team summarised each area, categorised in the following:

- Welfare
- Sports and Societies
- Education
- Community
- Representation
- Communications

PRES led the discussion, inviting the present members to agree where they believe the items should fall, with the best interests of the students.

The items below were the final agreements:

PWD – It was agreed that the suggested title going forward would be '*President of Wellbeing and Diversity*', members of the committee felt that Diversity should remain explicit within the role, giving a strong identity on the campus.

This role would encompass:

- Housing guidance and advice
- Health issues (including sexual health advice)
- Researching national and global wellbeing issues and acting on them
- Financial support for students (hardship)
- A focus on inclusivity on campus and within activities
- Campaigns with a focus on Equality and Diversity
- Provide outlets for emotional support and advice (including mental and physical issues)
- Enhancing participation with the SW5 program

POE – After being stated that the term 'Academic Affairs' expressed an almost 'disciplinary' tone, it was agreed that the title should be '*President of Education*'

This role would encompass:

- Aiding with educational needs which affect learning
- Be the student representative on academic committees
- Provide support and advice through appeals, complaints and misconduct cases
- Act upon issues regarding courses (including lecturing styles, timetabling, assessment and feedback)
- Be the lead representative for Course Reps
- Create a reliable team for support by communicating regularly with Chairs and Course Reps
- Careers and employability (shared with PRES)

PRES – Whilst no title change was discussed for this role, it was suggested that it should be referred to as *'President of the Students' Union'*

This role would encompass:

- Communicating ideas and feedback to the university
- Be the student representative on governing body
- Careers and employability (shared with POE)
- Ensuring student's voices are heard at the highest levels of the institution
- Be the local community link and represent students
- Be responsible for the student disciplinary procedures

The committee also discussed what they felt should be shared by **all** officers.

- Ensure all student groups and demographics are represented
- Ensure a balance between administration and student facing activities
- Work with all student representatives
- Be the key liaison with NUS
- Represent students within Sports and Societies
- Listen and act on the student voice at York St. John
- Provide advice to students
- Ensure students have a fun time whilst at York St. John
- Effectively communicate changes that will effect students
- Be the signpost for all available services at the institution
- Deliver campaigns
- Work with the university to secure funding opportunities and resources
- Ensure the successful delivery of Zones (specific to their role)
- Ensure all activities are accessible to the student body

7. Open discussion

AL played the new walk through video of the Students' Union for 2016

NAP was invited to the floor to answer any questions.

What would you like to see in the new building?

Students responded with the following suggestions:

- A kitchen for use AL noted that the Arts foyer currently have a kitchen for staff and student use.
- Lounge space for students
- Pool tables
- Table Tennis
- New 'Legend of Archies' wall.

Members also asked the following questions:

- When will this be ready? NAP responded stating the Students' Union should be readily available from September 2016.
- Will there be an outside space? NAP responded that the grass area of LMW accommodation will be a part of the union grounds.
- Will there be a smoking area? NAP reported that the new building would not feature a smoking area
- Looking at the plans, there doesn't seem to be a clear route through the building? NAP stated there are corridors and various walk ways in the building to navigate.

- What is happening to the current SU? NAP stated that the new NE corner project will see the building demolished to make way for new academic teaching space.
- Will there be a shop? NAP there won't be a shop in the building. Merchandise will be purchasable from reception and we will feature an e-shop.
- Will the new, modern look of the Students' Union ruin the image of the campus? NAP
 responded, stating that new developments on campus will see brand new spaces in
 several areas with a modern look, including the HG canteen and new teaching space.
- Will Archies day continue? NAP responded that it would, access to both entertainment spaces may be limited on these days but other space can be utilised.

Should we name the bar?

Members responded with two named ideas;

- Archies bar
- Cordukes bar

NAP called for an informal vote on the names, stating this would not solidify the identity of the bar but will give an idea.

MA opened up a social media communication for each name which receive further responses via Twitter.

What would you like to see at the last Archies day of the year?

Members put forward the following suggestions:

- Could we write a final message on a wall of the building (exterior)? NAP stated that this is an uncertainty, and dependant on the demolition of the building it may leave a negative impression for potential students.
- Free/retailed t-shirts? It was suggested creating an Archies collage t-shirt featuring all current/past logos for Archies events and giving them away free. Or retail them by having students pay £1-£2 which will go towards Sports and Societies dinners.
 - NAP responded that free sounds like a good idea, however to retail and charge students will be unfair to those who aren't a part of a Sport or Society.
 - A further suggestion asked what if the money was split between a set number of charities? NAP stated this could be possible.

What would you like to see at Freshers 2016?

Gig or live event – NAP responded that this would be expensive for large acts.

- Could there be a way to identify all year groups? difficult to locate freshers for Sports/Societies at the Freshers fair.
- Student bands/groups to perform similar to summer Archies 2015.
- More non-drinking events in the evening as well as daytime.

How should we promote freshers events?

- Social Media groups input events to them.
- Film an action camera video featuring the events of freshers.
- Inform 2nd/3rd years of what will be happening no idea this year
- No one was directed to the Students' Union this year which was an issue incentivise students to come to the building (boxes, NUS cards, key collection)
- Perhaps give tokens to students for a free drink or gift?
- Look at a rep system for 2nd/3rd year students to bring 1st years from halls to the Students' Union during the week.
- Physical advertisements i.e. A-boards.
- Text service informing students of upcoming events.
