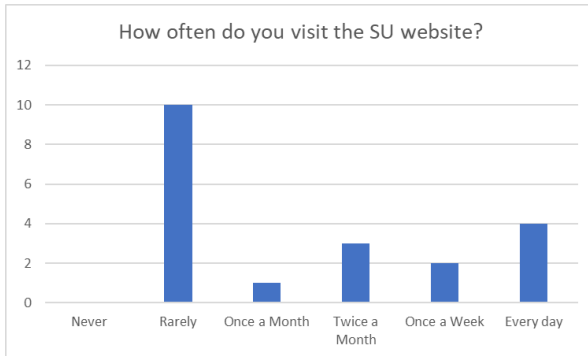

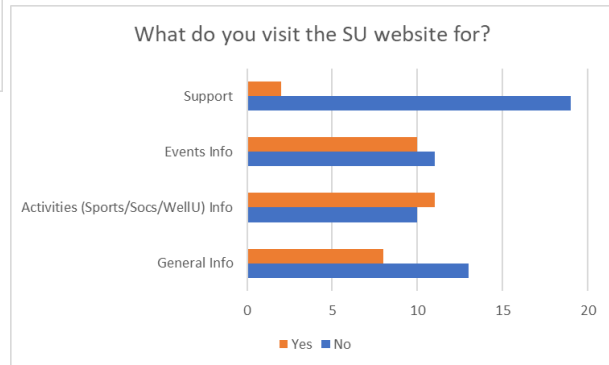


The main reason student accessed the SU website was for activities information

No students responded that they had never visited the SU website



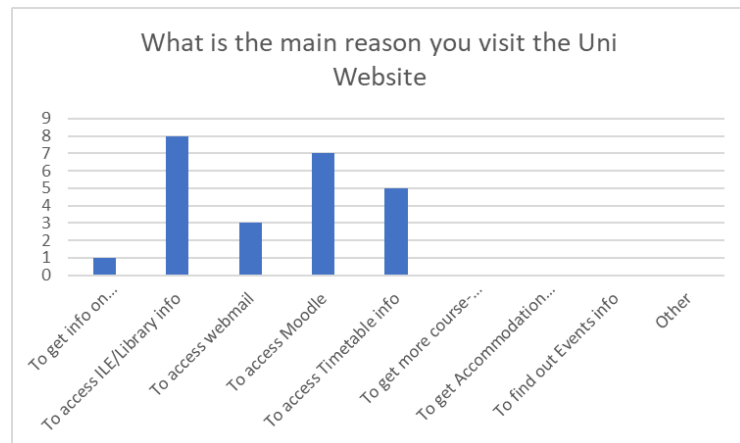

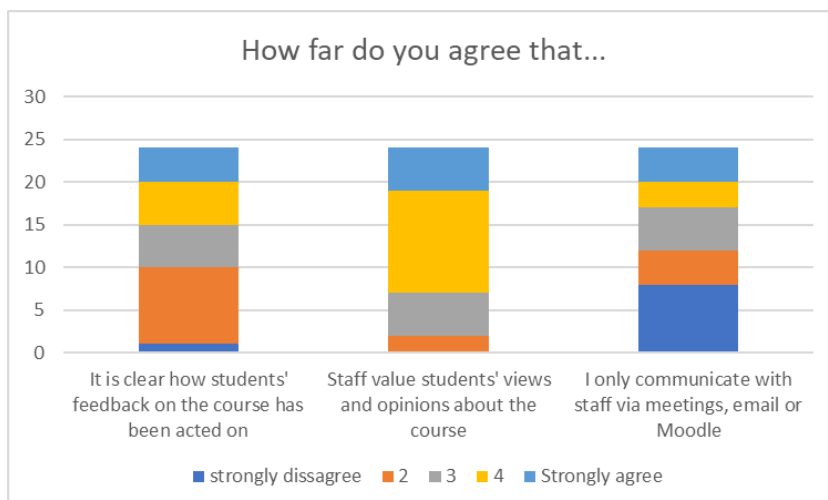
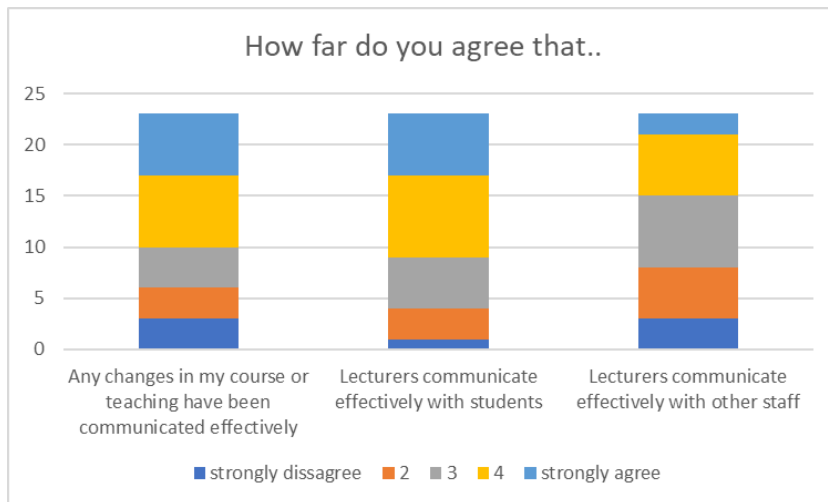
What would you like to see more of on the website?

- Good for my course but could be better for the uni as a whole

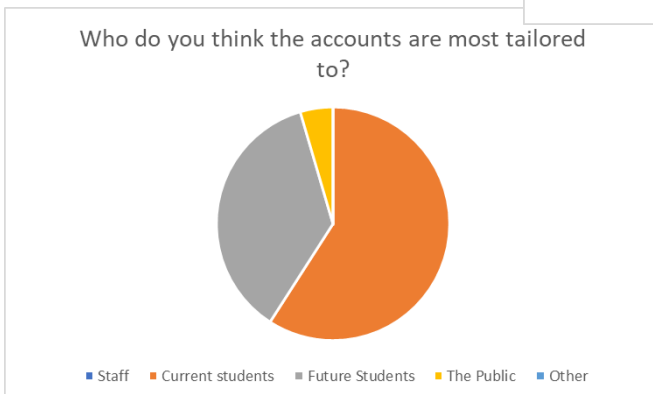
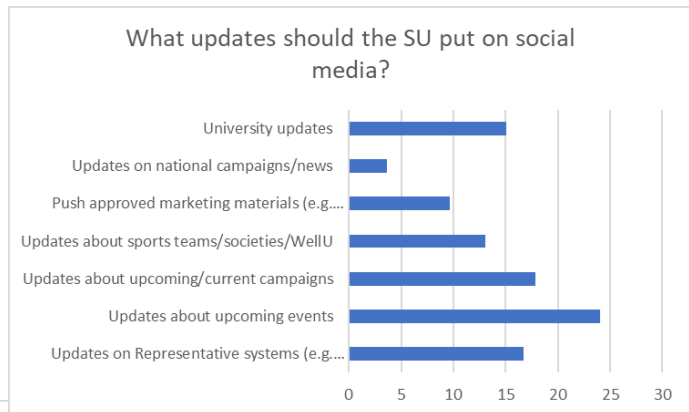
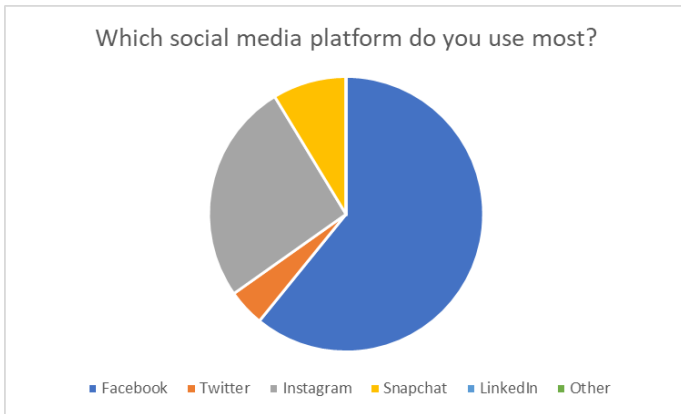
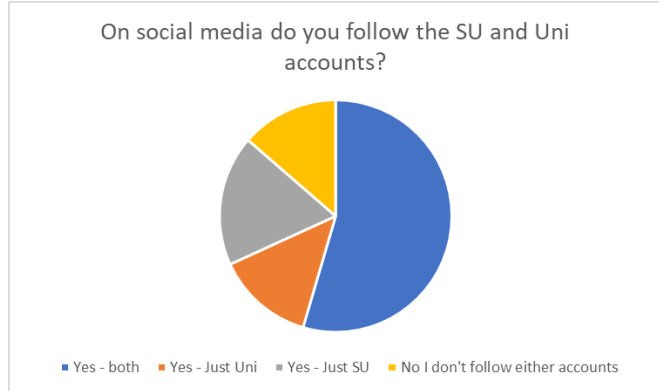
Social Media
